Keywords: List the keywords covered in your paper. These keywords will also be used by the publisher to produce a keyword index. (*use Arial 10*)

For the rest of the paper, please use Times New Roman 11

Abstract. This document explains and demonstrates how to prepare your camera-ready manuscript for BeTeQ 2005 *Publications*. The best is to read these instructions and follow the outline of this text. The text area for your manuscript must be **17 cm wide and 25 cm high**. Do not place any text outside this area. Use good quality, white paper of approximately 21 x 29 cm (A4). Your manuscript will be slightly reduced by the publisher. Please keep this in mind when designing your figures and tables etc.

Papers should be between six to eight pages long.

Organization of the Text

Section Headings. The section headings are in boldface capital and lowercase letters. Second level headings are typed as part of the succeeding paragraph (like the subsection heading of this paragraph).

Page Numbers. Do *not* print page numbers

Tables. Tables (refer with: Table 1, Table 2, ...) should be presented as part of the text, but in such a way as to avoid confusion with the text. A descriptive title should be placed below each table. The caption should be self-contained and placed the table.

Figures. Figures (refer with: Fig. 1, Fig. 2, ...) also should be presented as part of the text, leaving enough space so that the caption will not be confused with the text. The caption should be self-contained and placed *below* the figure

Equations. Equations (refer with: eq (1), eq (2), ...) have to be numbered sequentially, and the number put in parentheses at the right-hand edge of the text.

Literature References

References are cited in the text just by square brackets [1]. Two or more references at a time may be put in one set of brackets [3,4]. The references are to be numbered in the order in which they are cited in the text and are to be listed at the end of the contribution under a heading *References*, see our example below.
